Class Assemblies:



Reading Culture:

We're delighted with our reading progress in school. Last year's SATs results showed we were in the top 5% in the country for reading progress!



However, we're determined to maintain this through developing our reading for pleasure culture.

Our Y6 reading role models, alongside Miss Morris have been busy talking to children and staff about their reading habits and will be helping to design our 'new look' reading corners and school library. Look out for our videos with children and

teachers about what they like to read and coming soon, to a playground near you will be our 'Book Hive', where you'll be able to borrow any book to share with your family and return.

Young Carers Award:

Having previously been awarded the Bronze Award for Young Carers, we have now achieved the Silver mark. Mrs Fox works closely with Suffolk Young Carers to provide opportunities for children at school who are classified as Young Carers. It's lovely that our dedication for this group of children has been noticed and we're now working towards Gold!



Gatehouse caring in East Anglia

Gatehouse Charity are providing free online mindfulness courses specifically for parents/carers. The course is led by a clinical psychologist who is also a mindfulness teacher.

The mindfulness for parents' course is for parents who;

- Care or are former carers of a child with additional needs.
- Care or are former carers for an adult family member or friend.

Our 10 point Attendance Reminders:

1. Please take family holidays during the school holidays. Holidays in term time will be result in a fine (£60 per adult, per child)

2. Please call in before 9am if your child is not going to be at school. It saves us having to call you

3. If your child is regularly off due to illness, we will call you for a meeting to see how we can help

4. Absence due to illness can be unauthorised if we suspect your child is well enough to come to school

5. If your child comes into school after 9am, the registers are closed and it counts as 1 session of unauthorised absence

6. Too many unauthorised absences will result in a fine or a referral to our School Attendance Support Officer at Suffolk County Council

7. If your child has a medical appointment, please give school a copy of the appointment so we can authorise the absence

8. If you know there is an unusual or unexpected reason for your child's absence, please talk to us ahead of time (if possible). We may agree to authorise the absence.

9. 90% - or below - is classed as persistently absent / poor attendance (this is equivalent to a day off every 2 weeks!)

10. If you or your child have any worries about what's happening or has happened in school please bring your child in to school and talk to us about it. Please do not give your child a day off.

Of course, lots of bugs do go round this time of year which does effect our attendance significantly. However, if in doubt, please do send children into school – we will always send the children home if we feel they're too ill to be in school and we can give them Calpol if you give us written permission.

Please also remember, our registration points for attendance are 8:45-8:50am and 1-1:15pm.
