Snack and water

Home learning:

The children will continue to be given an English or maths task each week and this will usually be due in on Tuesdays unless otherwise stated. Anyone not handing in the work on time will stay in for part of their lunchtime to complete the task.

English: This half term, children will be studying a book called 'The matchbox diary' which is about how a boy records his life with objects in matchboxes as he is unable to write a diary. His life involves emigrating from Italy to America which also has links to our invaders and settlers topic. Once we have completed this we will be reading 'Beowulf' a traditional legend as well as writing a visitor leaflet for the Anglo Saxon village at West Stow.

Classes will be writing letters, balanced arguments, recounts in role and poetry before moving on to story writing.

Maths: There is a lot to cover in maths where year 5 are looking at multiplying, dividing and decimals and in year 6 ratio, proportion, area, measure and percentages. Please encourage your children to access Times Table Rock stars at home as this will help to improve their timetable knowledge.

Topic: Our topic this term is Invaders and Settlers focusing on the Anglo-Saxon's and Vikings. We will be looking at the chronology and geography of the countries involved, why they came to settle here and the impact they had on England and this local area in particular.

Science: Our Science this term is about evolution and inheritance. We will investigate how creatures evolve to suit their environment and consider the things that offspring inherit from their parents.
