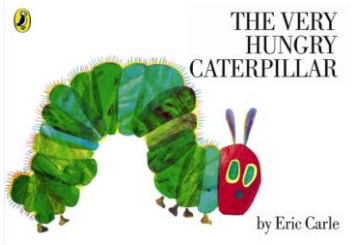




This week in Early Years...



Book of the week:



Thank you to all of the families that were able to join us for our Sports Partnership share session on Friday afternoon. The engagement from our EY families was amazing – we hope you enjoy using the kit that was provided for each child.

Maths focus of the week: Composition: we will practice recalling the parts of 5 when 1 part is not visible. We will use the rhyme ‘5 kittens jumping on the bed’; using our fingers as a visual aid, paying attention to how many fingers are ‘up’ and ‘folded down’. We will also build on our previous learning on the composition of 6 and 7 as ‘5 and a bit’, when we generalise that each of the numbers 6 to 9 can have 5 as a part.

Monday’s maths focus: manipulating shapes – including tangrams.
