Events so far...

We have had lots of exciting events happening at school so far in 2023, none more so than being able to take a choir of 45 children to London's O2 arena to perform with Young Voices. The children got to sing with 9,000 other school children in front of an audience of 11,000 alongside live bands, orchestras, beat boxers and professional dancers. They even fropermed as backing singers to Heather Small singing "What have you done today, to make you feel proud." I have to say, it brought me immense pride seeing them performing so well and having this amazing experience one that we now hope to repeat in future years. This trip was made possible through the support of Goward and Evans helping to fund the



coach travel. We are grateful, as ever, for all the experiences we're able to provide our children thanks to their generous donations.

Our Y5/6 indoor athletics team has been incredibly successful in a regional competition recently receiving a silver medal, closely behind a school in Newmarket. This is our best achievement to date in this competition, alongside a further silver medal in Cross Country earlier this year. We look forward to competing in lots more sporting events over the next few months.

We were also able to take our Y3/4 athletics team to compete against other schools. They too performed really well with a mid-table finish, showing resilience and determination. As always, we were impressed by their dastitute and their conduct when representing our school.

Individual Success: A special mention to Lucas H (Y5) who qualified to compete for Suffolk in swimming. Lucas managed to qualify for the final and came in 7th position with a personal best of 48.98 in 50m butterfly! Well done Lucas!

Each session starts with a different theme albeit in a relaxed and informal way.



Attendance:

Our attendance in school this year (93.4%) is in line with the national picture (but below the national target). Clearly, there were a lot of absences with colds and flu before Christmas and this can't be helped. However, today, (30th January) we only have two children off in the whole school! Hopefully this is a sign that everyone is now building up immunity again and keeping healthy. Long may it continue!

As always, when a child's attendance drops below 90% (equivalent of 1 day off every two weeks), letters are generated to encourage better attendance and the School Attendance Support Officer team become involved (formerly EWO).

To help improve your child's attendance, please try and avoid booking appointments within the school day. If you can't avoid this, the registers are taken at 8:50am and 1-1:15pm. If your child has an appointment within the school day but they are in school for the registration points, this will not have an effect on their attendance.
