## Phonemes we will be focusing on this week in school -



Pronunciation Phrase - s

Show your teeth and let the s hiss out sssss



Pronunciation Phrase - a

Open your mouth wide and make the a sound at the back of your mouth a α α



Pronunciation Phrase - t

Open your lips; put the tip of your tongue behind your teeth and press ttt



Pronunciation Phrase - p

Bring your lips together, push them open and say p

We will be orally blending words. Can you hear the phonemes in these words? Can you listen and then repeat the word?
