We've had a very busy few weeks in school with lots of activities, Christmas performances and opportunities for the children...with more still to come next week!

World Cup Workshops:

We celebrated the World Cup in style with each class learning about a different country. Across school, some children tried different foods, learnt a few foreign phrases and songs and each class had the chance to enjoy a dance workshop learning traditional dances from their class country. At the end of the day, each class performed like a real Dancer in a celebration of diversity and different cultures. We had a visit from an Ofsted Inspector a few weeks ago conducting some research into school's provision for music around the country. Christmas performances:

It's beginning to look a lot like Christmas at school. A big well done to all the children in Early Years for their lovely Christmas performance, 'All about Christmas,' last week. We have two performances from KS1 at the beginning of next week to look forward to as well. On the last day of term, as we have traditionally done as a school, children in KS2 will be walking to St. Mary's church for a Christmas 'assembly' where they will sing some carols and listen to some of our musicians perform. Unfortunately, due to space in the church, we cannot invite parents to this but we will share photos and videos.

Christmas Jumper Day in School:

We will be allowing children to wear Christmas jumpers/tops or Christmas dresses on **Wednesday 14th December** which is our Christmas dinner day in school.
