Maths focus of the week:

Composition: Composing and decomposing numbers involves the children investigating part-partwhole relations, e.g. seeing that 7 can be made of 5 and 2. A key focus will be on partitioning 7 (splitting it into parts) and thinking about the missing part.

Our Monday maths will focus on exploring the properties of 3D shapes and finding 2D shapes within 3D shapes.
