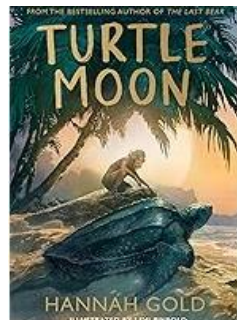
Welcome

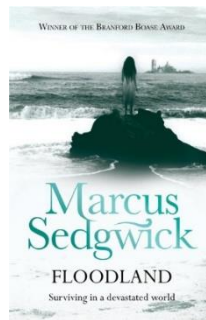

Learning this term

Reading for pleasure book:
Turtle Moon, by

English book:
Floodland, by

English - 'Floodland' is set in East Anglia in the future where water levels have risen leaving large parts flooded and places like Norwich and Ely have become islands. Our upcoming trip to Ely Cathedral will show the children the real life setting for the story. We will be writing letters, diary entries, persuasive speeches, poetry and making up new narrative parts to the story.

Maths - Our main focus this term will be concentrating on place value and the four operations: adding, subtraction, multiplication and division. Please encourage your children to access Times Table Rock stars at home as this will help to improve the speed and accuracy of their times table knowledge.

Science - Our Science the first half term will be forces and there will be practical investigations involving forces. In the second half term we will be learning about Earth and Space. Learning the names of planets in our solar system and the phases of the moon.

Key vocab for forces: *gravity, upthrust, buoyancy, air resistance, water resistance, Isaac Newton, friction, opposing forces.*

Topic - Our topic this term is Sustainable Earth? We will be working on geography skills including mapping, consider the environmental challenges facing our World and consider how things might be improved for future generations.

Key Vocab: *environment, recycle, sustainable, fossil fuels, pollution human geography, physical geography, , reusable, emissions*

DT Our Design and technology project this term will be food technology and we shall be planning for and making fair trade biscuits.

ART Children will be working on their drawing skills. They will learn the 7 elements of drawing as well as techniques to do with colour.

PE For our first term sessions will usually be outside so come dressed appropriately (no earrings or hoodies please). We will be working on skills for basketball and playing outdoor team games.

Computing Our first module this term will be about computer systems and our second half term will involve planning and making a video.

Home learning

Spelling/Reading Weekly spellings will be on sheets that will be kept in a folder in school and children will be given time to write these out each day. A list of the spellings for each week will be posted onto Google Classroom allowing children to work on spellings at home. As part of the homework, we still expect children should **read at home for at least 15 minutes every day**. Quizzes can be taken outside of school if your child finishes a book.

Home learning The children will be given an English comprehension or maths task each week and this will usually be due in on Tuesdays unless otherwise stated. Anyone not handing in the work on time will stay in for part of their lunchtime to complete the task.

Healthy snack - Please send your child in with a piece of fruit or vegetable that they can have at break time - crisps, biscuits, cheese and popcorn are only for lunchtime. Please also send your child in with a bottle of water.

School uniform - Even though this may be your child's last year in primary school our expectations for uniform remain the same. No sportswear (joggers or leggings) except for PE days and no hoodies. Earrings should be plain 'stud' style and not hoops of any kind.
