News

New Arrivals: As you may have been aware, earlier this term we interviewed for a Deputy Head. The governors and I were delighted to appoint two fantastic deputies and this will help to expand our leadership team going forward. Mrs Page, who has been a great leader and support in her role as Acting Deputy over the last year, will now hold one of the posts permanently and she will focus on pastoral care across school.

Mrs Cocks, who is joining us from a school in Newmarket, will take on the other deputy position and she will have more of a focus on teaching and learning and our curriculum. We very much look forward to welcoming Mrs Cocks after Easter.

Staff Leaving: Sadly, Mrs Buckle will be leaving us after the Easter break. She has been such an amazing teacher for Wombat Class, who I know will really miss her next term - as will all the staff who have absolutely loved working with her! Mrs Fancy will now be teaching four days a week in Wombat Class and we look forward to welcoming Miss Francis back (a former teacher here) to teach on Thursdays. I'm sure Mrs Buckle will pop back to properly say goodbye to the class after Easter and I dare say she'll pop in and see how they're all getting on throughout the term.

March Experiences

Chick-hatching:

This was such a wonderful experience that the whole school community got behind. Lots of parents were following on our live 'Chick Cam' - I counted 22 people still logged in watching the first couple of chicks hatch at 10:30pm one evening (long after most of the children would be asleep). All children got to see the chicks with their classes and most had the opportunity to hold them. Mrs Lewis and Dawn (one of our cleaners) were able to rehome the chicks at the end of the experience so we can still see updates of how they're getting on... who knows, maybe a couple can visit school again soon!





Year $\frac{3}{4}$ trip to High Lodge: Children in Y3/4 went to High Lodge for a school trip. Whilst there, they took part in a bug hunt, music trail, nature walk (and obviously spent a bit of time exploring the play parks!) It was a really lovely day and the children were a credit to the school!



Year ½ trip to Mountfitchet Castle

Children in KS1 went to visit Mountfitchet Castle and Toy Museum. They had a fantastic day exploring the grounds, learnt about toys throughout history and had close encounters with the livestock at lunch!





Year 5/6 - Live Author Event

Children in Y5/6 took part in a live virtual author event. The author, Dr Maggie Aderin Pocock, has published various books about space and children were able to send in auestions for her to answer.

Tag Rugby Festival

We were able to take a group of children from Y3/4 to a Tag Ruby festival at Newmarket Rugby Club. Children had the opportunity to develop skills and work together as a team. They even got to hold the Rugby Union Premiership Trophy and meet a player from Leicester Tigers.



Writing Competition: Mrs Knight's annual writing competition took place, inspired by our author visit last month. Children had the chance to enter a story based on 'The Funny Life of....' We had 45 entries and it was a really tough competition to judge. All children that entered have received a voucher to wear non-uniform on Friday 21st March and the winners and runners up also received a lovely goody bag full of prizes and treats!

Gifted and Talented Maths Experience

Four children in Y6 went for a Maths workshop run by A.I.M and hosted at Elveden Academy. They had to take part in Maths challenges throughout the day involving some fun problems and puzzles.



Lakenheath's Got Talent Show

We've had such a fantastic morning today watching our school talent show. All children were given the opportunity to perform a talent in front of their year groups. We had some excellent auditions and the best 2 or 3 acts in each class got to perform in front of the school on our last day of term. The teachers even got in on the act! School Dinners/ Breakfast Club

Unfortunately, as we start a new financial year, the governing body have had to make the difficult decision to increase some of the costs for breakfast club and school dinners. We appreciate that everyone has been affected by the cost of living increases and sadly our school budget is no different. In order to cover our own expenditures our new prices have to be as follows:

Breakfast Club: £3.50 (£1.50 for children in receipt of Pupil Premium).

School Dinners: £2.60

Attendance:

Our attendance in school this year continues to increase gradually (93.9%) which is in line with the national picture (but still below our target). Thank you for your support with encouraging better attendance.

As always, when a child's attendance drops below 90% (equivalent of 1 day off every two weeks), letters are generated to encourage better attendance and the School Attendance Support Officer team become involved (formerly EWO).



Parents Survey: March 2023


My child is happy at LCPS




My child feels safe at school


The school care about my child's wellbeing 45 responses







There is someone I can talk to at school if I have any concerns




The school responds to any concerns raised in a timely fashion 44 responses
















All the general comments:
