Through this, we have encountered transport costs to use larger buses to enter more teams on a number of occasions. Additionally, our success has meant travel to 3 different county finals in Netball, Panathlon and Orienteering, in locations of Haughley, Bury St Edmunds and Ipswich, again using transport to give the children the opportunity to compete at a higher level.</p> <p>Children have won 3 events this year in Netball the Panathlon, and became County champions in Orienteering. Many of them progressed well with the opportunity and have taken up swimming outside of school. We used a booster 6 week block to catch up some Year 5 & 6's who hadn't passed previous requirements. This helped some of them meet the swimming requirements and be able to swim competently.
