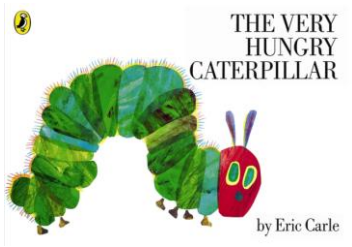




This week in Early Years...
