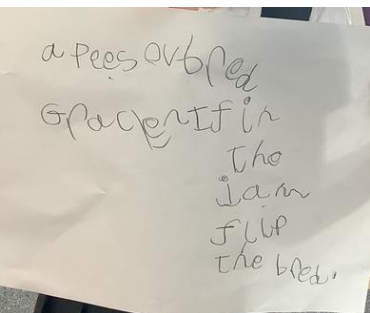


We started week three with celebrating the Lunar New Year, before exploring our new focus text The Gigantic Turnip. The children were fantastic at retelling the story!





Week four started with making jam sandwiches as we explored algorithms in our computing learning, and then we had a Teddy Bear's picnic.



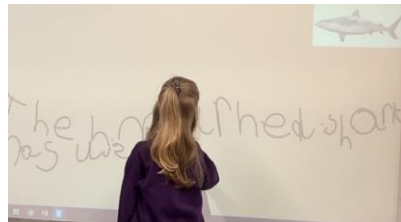
Then we began our new focus text of Jack and the Beanstalk and explored healthy food choices.

When we returned from our half term break our new theme of Under the Sea began with our trip to the Sea Life Centre.



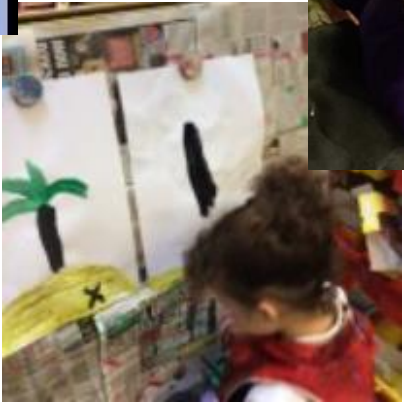
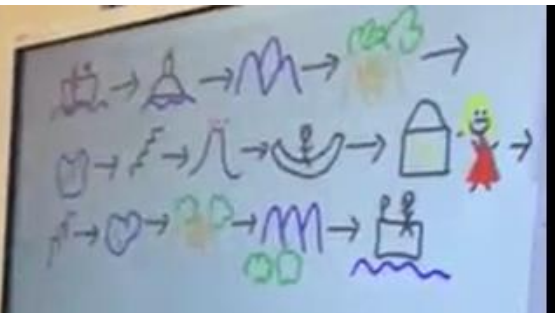
There were many opportunities to complete different craft projects. Our focus text was an information book about sharks. We completed some shared writing before writing our own fact sentences and shared poetry.

We discovered how the Welsh celebrate St David's Day.

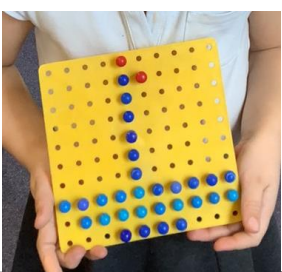




During weeks nine and ten we focused on pirates and introduced our new focus text 'The Treasure of Pirate Frank.' We practised reciting this repetitive and rhyming tale and created our own treasure maps. Lots of children enjoyed dressing up and taking on the role of a pirate too. We also met the chicks.



We focused on the story of 'Lost and Found' during the final two weeks of term. We explored dangerous weather and how to stay safe in it. We consider different methods of transport to get to the South Pole and completed a science experiment to find out the best materials to make a boat from.



The children also listened to information about Autism Acceptance and made their own sensory bottles.
